

Evidently, we do not claim that we solve all the problems of the world; but we are responsible for delivering aid to people in need and reaching out to them as much as possible.



PRINCIPLES

VOLUNTEERISM

DWWT operates by adopting volunteerism within its capacity. We care about peoples' suffering and dream of being a cure not only for particular people but for people everywhere in the world and use our experience, time, effort and means we possess to achieve our dreams, independently of our personal gains.

NOT HARMING

DWWT evaluates the consequences of the aid basing on the principle of 'Do not harm first!' of medicine; and calculates the individual, social and environmental impact. It is a moral obligation for Doctors Worldwide Turkey not to harm anybody with the aids.

AUTONOMY AND BRIEFING

DWWT informs the patients about the details of the medical treatment, the possible consequences and complications that may be encountered by the medical intervention in accordance with the autonomy which is the basic principle of medical ethics and the precondition for good medicine.

LEGITIMATE AND SCIENTIFIC METHOD APPLICATION

DWWT executes its projects by applying the proven diagnosis and treatment methods, based on the principles of preventive medicine. In any case, DWWT never uses non-scientific methods in diagnosis and treatment of patients and never uses any chemical, pharmacological or biological substances that have not been passed through the necessary scientific steps and have not the appropriate license yet.

PRIVACY

DWWT does not share the information of the patients in need of medical support with third parties without getting patient's consent and approval.

RESPECT FOR HUMAN AND DOCTOR'S NEUTRALITY

DWWT respects human health, human life, and personality in their activities. DWWT gives the utmost care and attention when examining and treating the patients, with no discrimination based on gender, race, nationality, religion, sect, ethical angles, personality, social status and political view.

NOT BEING INVOLVED IN UNAUTHORIZED AREAS

DWWT, when on duty, does not engage in any attempt that requires special knowledge or skills that it does not possess, except when there are compulsory cases where any delay may threaten a patient's life.

EMERGENCIES AND WAR

DWWT implements universal rules of medical ethics with impartiality in all circumstances and conditions.

DWWT assists people in need of medical help in extraordinary situations such as war, deportation, and asylum, within the framework of universal legal principles.



AREAS OF ACTIVITY



EMERGENCY SERVICES

DWWT sets up teams to provide emergency response, aid, and treatment services in all exceptional cases such as war or crisis, while as it also dispatches medical supplies, equipment, and medicines for this purpose.



PREVENTIVE HEALTH SERVICES

DWWT organizes awareness raising and vaccination activities to prevent epidemics of common diseases and to eliminate its threats to people's health. It treats severe nutritional disorders by opening maternity, infant health and nutrition centers for children and pregnant women who do not have access to basic food supplies and therefore affected negatively. DWWT develops projects on women's health. It organizes Qurbani and its distribution activities as a nutritional supplement. In order to prevent HIV/AIDS, it organizes camps for the circumcision of children.



MEDICAL HEALTH SERVICES

DWWT develops projects and programs for diseases that cannot be cured with local resources by both surgical and internal medicine and coordinates volunteer health teams in this context.



HEALTH UNITS IMPLEMENTATION AND MANAGEMENT PROJECTS

DWWT carries out long-term and permanent projects to improve health systems and regions in need services by in developing the projects for shipment, installation, and management of health units (hospitals, health centers, and laboratories).



HEALTH EDUCATION PROJECTS

DWWT organizes education, certification and specialization programs at associate degree, undergraduate, and graduate levels in order to increase the capacity of health professionals in the countries it serves; and it also supports scientific research and activities by coordinating scientific congresses.



WAR AND CRISIS-STRICKEN REGIONS







SYRIAN CRISIS

In March 2011, the Syrian regime responded to public's demand for freedom with military crackdown and massive attacks in Dara province. The number of casualties, wounded, and refugees who are forced to leave their houses, are increasing day by day.

Following the clashes that took place during this period and according to the United Nations data, 200,000 people lost their lives in Syria. According to The Office of the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees (UNHCR) data, more than 3,200,00 Syrians seek refugee in the neighboring countries. 1,147,000 of these refugees live in Lebanon, 520,000 in Jordan, 200,000 in Iraq, and 137,000 in Egypt. While the number of refugees living in the camps in Turkey is estimated to be 223,921, the number of refugees living outside camps is more than 891,000. Actual figures are thought to be even greater as the refugees are not all registered through UNHCR. In addition, 7.6 million people became internal refugees in Syria. The exact number of injuries is unknown because in some cases the regime arrests them as they reach the hospitals for treatment. Every day, hundred of Syrians who are injured by firearms and cannot reach relevant institutions to get health care services are waiting to be rescued without getting proper treatment. Doctors Worldwide Turkey began to work in order to help the asylum seekers in Lebanon as soon as the events had started. At the Wadi Khaled region on the Syria-Lebanon border, a Triage Center was established in cooperation with Islamic Medical Association (IMA) / Lebanon in order to ensure the safe transfer of the injured people to hospitals in inner regions by deploying first responder teams. Afterwards, a blood bank and a laboratory base was formed in Dar El Shifa Hospital and a considerable amount of medication shipment was carried out. Furthermore, voluntary health care teams were also sent to Tripoli. As the ripples of the crisis were felt on the Turkey border, health stations were set up in Yayladagi, Hatay, and Suruc and a pharmacy in Syria. Medical supplies composed of surgical bags and large amounts of medication were delivered to the region. A circumcision feast was arranged for the Syrian infants in Yayladagi, and food aid was provided to families during Ramadan.

YERYÜZÜ DOKTORLARI

The health station of DWW Turkey at Yayladagi operates 5 days a week with a team of 11 employees consisting of 1 gynecologist, 1 cardiologist, 1 physiotherapist, 1 pharmacist, 1 dentist, 1 laborant, 1 pediatrist, 2 nurses, and 2 administrative officers.

An average of 150 patients are provided health care services at the internal medicine, family medicine, and dental clinics every day. The medications are also provided free of charge at the DWWT Pharmacy. In the region, the physiotherapy devices donated by a Libyan benefactor also serves the Syrian casualties. Doctors Worldwide Turkey is currently planning to provide trainings to doctors in orthopedics, trauma, and anesthesia fields in Syria. Moreover, Doctors Worldwide Turkey serves voluntarily at the Health Center located in Damascus; and around 10,000 Syrians who do not live in camps are offered health care services at the Health Station which also includes a pharmacy. As of December 2014, the number of patients receiving service from this station exceeded 30,000.

DOCTORS WORLDWIDE TURKEY SANLIURFA-SURUC HEALTH STATION



Due to the attacks intensified around Kobani (Aynl-EL Arab) and its surroundings on Thursday September 19, 2014, people began to pass the border from Kobani to Suruc district of Sanliurfa.

Doctors Worldwide Turkev acted promptly at the outbreak of the refugee movements and first dispatched medication to the region by using Mobile Health Centers allocated by the Community Health Center (TSM). These centers provided refugees settled in Suruc and its surroundings with health care services with the help of Voluntary Health care Teams composed of family physicians, emergency medicine specialists, and pharmacists.

A health station has been established in order to offer services to nearby villages with limited access to health care services and to the refugees who have settled in Suruc Camp. At this station, there are 3 doctors and 1 staff in the pharmacy established by the Doctors Worldwide Turkey.

The boarding school (YIBO), where the health station serves, hosts approximately 6,500 refugees.

In the health station where 10,000 patients have been examined since September, 600 people have been vaccinated against measles and polio.

The main diseases are as follows: hypertension, acute diabetes, lower respiratory infection, gastritis, infectious diseases caused by dusty environment, anxiety and psychological diseases due to trauma caused by war.



TURKMEN MOUNTAIN DOCTORS WORLDWIDE TURKEY PHARMACY

A pharmacy was opened in the Turkmen Mountain region of Svria in order to transfer medication to the areas where there are people in need.

SULTANBEYLI CHECK-UP

In February 2014, DWW Turkey made the health check of 65 people living in Sultanbeyli and distributed medication by a team of 1 family physician and 3 volunteers from Young DWWT.



SIRNAK-MADEN REFUGEE **CAMP CLINIC**

Doctors Worldwide Turkey opened a clinic in November 2014 to provide primary health services for the refugees living in Sirnak Maden Camp. In the clinic, health care services are provided free of charge by 2 doctors, 2 nurses, 2 emergency medical technicians, 1 pharmacist, and 5 other health personnel to Yezidi refugees from Sinjar. 3,882 patients were treated in the clinic by the end of 2014.


PSYCHO-SOCIAL SUPPORT

PROGRAM

In cooperation with Hayat Foundation, a psychosocial support program has been realized with the participation of 800 Syrian children in Arab and Turkmen refugee camps in Yayladagi.

MEDICINE AND MEDICAL SUPPLY AID

Since the beginning of the conflicts, the total amount of the medication and medical supplies delivered to the region by the Doctors Worldwide Turkey has exceeded 34 million TL.

CENTRAL AFRICAN CRISIS

Thousands of people lost their lives and hundreds of thousands of people had to migrate to neighbouring countries such as Cameroon, DR Congo, Congo, and Chad, due to political impotence arose in Central African Republic towards the end of 2013; and violent incidents started with political reasons.

Doctors Worldwide Turkey provided health and humanitarian aid to those who have to take shelter in neighboring countries such as Cameroon and Chad, and especially in Bangui - the capital of Central African Republic - from the first day of the crisis. Within the framework of the Central African Crisis, Doctors Worldwide Turkey, who provide primary health care services with the Chifa Clinic project in the PK5 region of Bangui where is densely populated by Muslims, aime to eliminate the need for food in the region through Ramadan and Qurbani organisations.

Doctors Worldwide Turkey, who initiated studies on Central African refugees affected by the crisis, drilled water wells in Chad N'djamena (Encemine) region, established the Chifa Clinic in Doyaba Regufee Camp in Sarh region, and sent voluntary health care teams to this area. Delivering water tablets to the camps located on the Cameroon-OAC borderline, we aimed to remedy the shortage of clean water in the camp and take measures against Cholera and Ebola outbreaks.

DOBA HEALTH CLINIC

Doctors Worldwide Turkey provided primary health care services with a doctor, two nurses, and a pharmacist at Doba Refugee Camp located in Sarh Region of Chad, together with Doba Health Clinic between July-December 2014. In addition to free health care services, free medication is also provided in the clinic.

CAMEROON



WATER TABLET DELIVERY

As 65 people lost their lives due to cholera outbreak, and 1,300 people contracted this disease in Cameroon within two months, Doctors Worldwide Turkey sent 4,730 (10 pallets) water purification kits to the MBLE camp of Central African refugees. The 5 trailer trucks carrying humanitarian aid materials were shipped by airway to Youndé Airport. After a journey lasting approximately 15 hours on land, they reached the MBLE camp in Bertoua located on the borderline of Cameroon and Central African Republic. By means of these water purification tablets, the clean water problem has been largely eliminated in the camp, where nearly 10,000 refugees live.



VOLUNTARY HEALTH TEAMS

Doctors Worldwide Turkey provided primary health care services with a doctor, two nurses, and a pharmacist at Doba Refugee Camp located in Sarh Region of Chad, together with Doba Health Clinic between July-December 2014. In addition to free health care services, free medication is also provided in the clinic.

GAZA ATTACKS

Doctors Worldwide started their studies in Palestine in 2001 by organizing advanced diagnosis and treatment trainings on psychic trauma for pscyhiatric employees. In the following years, they focused on providing emergency health service during the attacks on Gaza strip, followed by rehabilitation services. Upon the restart of Israeli attacks on July 8, 2014, the amount of the aid provided to Gaza is increased as a part of Disaster and Emergency services. After an initial review, medication worth of USD 200,000 is purchased and delivered to Gaza in order to bolster the medication stock. Following the attacks, they went to Gaza for the evacuation of casualties, and needs analysis was carried out. In the light of these analyses and in addition to medication aid, the physical therapy centers, hospitals, and laboratories in Gaza are supported and health training projects are initiated in order to improve the damaged health system.

PROJECTS FOR GAZA



KHAN YUNIS PHYSICAL TREATMENT AND REHABILITATION CENTER

It is a project about establishing and operating a new physical therapy and rehabilitation center in the Khan Yunis region located in the South of Gaza. At the center, it is planned to provide free service to 10,000 patients in 2 years.

GAZA ISLAMIC UNIVERSITY PHYSICAL TREATMENT LABORATORY

The students of Physical Therapy and Rehabilitation department at Gaza Islamic University used to have their hands-on training in Al-Amal Hospital, which is seriously damaged by the attacks in 2014. Therefore, the students tried to continue their trainings in small clinics and encountered difficulties. Within the scope of the project, it is planned to supply the missing equipment of the damaged laboratory.



CONSOLIDATION OF PHYSICAL THERAPY AND REHABILITATION CENTERS

The aim of the project is to provide equipment and financial support to two physical therapy and rehabilitation centers which continue to provide services with their limited facilities in the North Gaza region and Gaza city.

HEALTH CARE AT HOME PROJECT

The project aims to set up mobile teams which will use the Khan Yunis Physical Therapy and Rehabilitation Center as headquarters. Within the scope of the project, mobile health teams will provide health services, especially to the wounded people in the latest attacks, and make necessary treatments and controls.



SOMA DISASTER

On May 13, 2014, 301 miners are martryed and 432 children were orphaned in a mine disaster in Manisa Soma. Due to the trauma seen especially in the children after the disaster, the project of 'Game Therapy for the Children of Soma' was developed by Doctors Worldwide Turkey and the Pedagogical Society.

Within the scope of the project, two game therapy rooms were set up in a primary school located in the district. The children were interviewed by reaching the miners' families living around the school, and the children to be treated were determined. Twenty children aged between 2 and 12 were enrolled in 6-session Children-centered Game Therapy and Puppet and Art Therapy between June 18 - 26. Moreover, therapeutic toy sets were distributed to 100 children who were unable to obtain the therapy. In total, 108 sessions were given to 18 children in 7 days.



EBOLA OUTBREAK

Ebola disease has a fatality rate ranging between 25% and 90%; and it is transmitted through direct or indirect contact with the blood or bodily secretions of the patient or through contact with disintegrated skin or even with intact skin, although the root cuse is still unexplained. The West African Ebola outbreak, which began in late May 2014, was declared to be a third-degree emergency in July and an International Health Emergency Status in August by the WHO. Since the outbreak was detected, the number of people suffering from this disease has been reported to be over 20,000. The number of people who lost their lives has been reported to be over 9.000 in 9 different countries. 837 of the health workers who played a major role in the fight against the epidemic caught Ebola virus and 490 of them lost their lives.

Doctors Worldwide Turkey started a project to send personal protective equipment in order to support the health workers and treatment centers in Sierra Leone and Liberia, which are the most affected countries by the epidemic. By this way, it would be possible to enable the health workers, who are spread thin, to continue their work and to fight with the epidemic. In the scope of the project, aid containers consisting of a total of 740,000 medical equipment including protective masks, isolation garments, anti-splash masks, Tyvek masked dresses, and Tyvek protective garments were sent to Sierra Leone and Liberia Ministries of Health.

PREVENTIVE HEALTH SERVICES

MATERNITY, INFANT, AND NUTRITION HEALTH CENTERS

Doctors Worldwide Turkey have undertaken the operating costs of the Gambela Kamina, Lumata, Lualaba, Ngoy-mani, and Malemba clinics located in the rural areas of the Democratic Republic of Congo since March 2014. The common thread to these clinics is that they are in rural areas where the need for health and humanitarian aid is at the highest level. The clinics in these regions, where population density is high, were established in 2005 with the support of the Doctors Worldwide UK Office. These clinics, each of which completes nearly 50 births per month, and serves nearly 150 mothers and babies with health care services, have started to be supported by the Doctors Worldwide Turkey starting from 2014.

CIRCUMCISION

Doctors Worldwide Turkey organizes circumcisions as a preventive health service against sexually transmitted diseases such as AIDS. In this context, thousands of children were circumcised in Kenya, Congo, Georgia, Syria, Turkey, Macedonia, and Bulgaria.



Within the scope of "We Make the Circumcision of Syrian Refugee Children, You Be the Kirve" campaign initiated by Doctors Worldwide Turkey, a circumcision ceremony was held on January 4-5, 2014 in Osmaniye Cevdetiye Turkmen Camp. The volunteers of Doctors Worldwide Turkey organized circumcision of 126 Syrian children and made a donation of 30 TL to each child living in the tent city in Yayladagi. Besides, with the psychotherapy team of 3 people, they provided psychological support to 500 children, played games, and drew pictures together. In the circumcision ceremony held on March 2, 2014 in Istanbul Halkali, 22 Syrian children were circumcised.






CIRCUMCISION CEREMONY

The children in Kelkit were circumcised in the feast held with the participation of Kelkit State Hospital and Doctors Worldwide Turkey. 120 children were circumcised in the feast which lasted for 2 weeks. Among the circumcised were children who could not be circumcised for years because they were disabled.



QURBANI AID

In 2014, as it does every year, Doctors Worldwide Turkey made Qurban feast organisations in many countries in order to improve health and living conditions. These organisations were initiated in line with the needs of the countries in which health care projects were carried out. In 2014, the crisis-stricken regions and regions with increasing number of refugees are also included. Kenya, Democratic Republic of Congo, Niger, Gambia, Somalia, Ghana, Chad, Cameroon, and Central Africa are determined as countries that need aid within the scope of 2014 African Qurbani Campaign prepared by Doctors Worldwide Turkey. The number of qurbani animals is determined according to the reports on previous projects and local needs of each country. It has also been observed that the sacrificial gurbani are primarily delivered to the people living in rural areas with health problems caused by malnutrition. In addition to these countries, qurbani meats were distributed in Syria and Bosnia. Health teams of volunteers were send to Chad, Niger, and Bosnia and primary health care was provided during the feast.






FOOD AID


As part of preventive health services, Doctors Worldwide Turkey have provided food aid in Central Africa, Niger, the Democratic Republic of Congo and Kenya during Ramadan.

In the Bangui PK5 region of Central Africa, Ramadan food parcels worth USD 10,000 consisting of flour, sugar, oil, rice, tomato, milk, pasta, and mutton were distributed. In Niger, rice, sugar, and oil packages worth USD 10,000 were distributed to 175 families. Parcels worth USD 15,000 consisting of oil, sugar, flour, rice, and pasta were distributed to 700 families in the Lubumbashi province of the Democratic Republic of Congo. Whereas, 1,200 people were provided hot meals for iftar in the Lamu district of Kenya.

The number of physicians in underdeveloped countries is very low compared to our country. The number of physicians who are able to perform the necessary examination, surgery, and medical treatment in complicated cases is very low. Voluntary health teams are organized in line with the needs of countries in order to carry out these treatments on site and with less cost. Along with these teams, medication, surgical supplies, and necessary equipment are also available for treatment. A total of 22 voluntary health teams were sent to different countries in 2014.

Cleft lip and palate is formed due to non merging on lip or palate or sometimes on both of them with various reasons during face development of a baby at embryonic period. Doctors Worldwide Turkey arranges plastic surgery camps within the scope of Smiling Children project launched against this defect which negatively affects both physical and psychological development of the children.

Within 2014, 2 plastic surgery camps were held in Sudan, Sierra Leone and Azerbaijan and 139 operations were carried out in these camps in total.

MEDICINE AND MEDICAL AID

It is known that 1.7 billion people in the world (30% of the world population) do not have any access to medication in their lives. In Africa, this rate is 50%. However, it appears that 1/3 of the antimalarials in Africa are counterfeit. Just by enabling access to antimalarials, 10 million lives can be saved per year.

Doctors Worldwide Turkey provide drugs and medical supply aid to underdeveloped and developing countries in line with their needs. Drugs and medical supplies donated by pharmaceutical companies or purchased with cash donations are sent with the voluntary health teams to established hospitals, clinics and maternal, infant and nutrition health centers.

SOMALIA DR OSMAN FIQI (CHIFA) HOSPITAL

With the outbreak of the Horn of Africa Crisis in July 2011, Doctors Worldwide Turkey began to actively work in Somalia. In the first place, food and cash aid was provided in the region. Then, as a result of the needs analysis, it was determined that a general hospital was needed in Mogadishu. The Chifa Hospital was opened on March 6, 2012 and provided free health care services to more than 100,000 people until the end of 2013. At the beginning of 2014, the Chifa Hospital was transferred to the FIQI Foundation, a local partner, on the condition that it will support the hospital's budget and the patients in need will be treated free of charge. The name of the hospital is changed as Dr. Osman Hospital which is the only fully fledged hospital in Mogadishu including a newborn care unit, ultrasonography devices, and two modern operating theaters.





DOCTORS WORLDWIDE TURKEY HEWA BORA HOSPITAL

Doctors Worldwide Turkey has been operating a hospital in Hewa Bora, Lubumbashi region of the Democratic Republic of Congo where 500,000 people out of 2 million population have lowincome since 2005. The hospital has a capacity of 50 beds and is the third largest hospital in the region. It provides services with gynecology, orthopedics, and gastroenterelogy departments; pediatric, eye, and dental policlinics; two operating theaters, two intensive care units, x ray rooms, a pharmacy, a full-service laboratory, emergency service and three VIP patient wards. In 2014, projects are developed in order to supply the medical equipment of the hospital, set up necessary health teams, technical teams, service teams, and management team, train the existing teams on-site by bringing to Turkey, drill clean water wells, and put everything into service for the local community.



Until January 2013, there had been no specialization in medicine in Somalia, which had limited medical education at the undergraduate level. Somalian general practitioners had to improve themselves and get specialised in their field either by going abroad or by following the examinations and operations of voluntary doctors who come to their country. In February 2013, in order to help fill this gap, Doctors Worldwide Turkey started the Somalia Specialization Program in Medicine under the roof of Benadir University, the only university in Somalia which is almost at international standards, with the support of Istanbul Medeniyet University and TIKA.

14 doctors in the General Surgery branch and 7 doctors in the Internal Medicine branch are continuing their specialization in medicine programs. The 3-year education program has been conducted in Somalia for 10 months and in Turkey for 2 months in a year.



ISLAMIC UNIVERSITY IN UGANDA

Uganda Islamic University in Uganda (IUIU) was established in 1988 to provide education for English-speaking countries in Eastern Africa with the support of the Organization for Islamic Cooperation (OIC). It has more than 15,000 graduates from 70 undergraduate programs in 6 faculties ranging from Faculty of Law to Faculty of Islamic Studies.

IUIU, the first and only university founded by Muslims in Uganda where there are only 25 universities, has launched the Faculty of Medicine project on October 27, 2014 with 55 students under the founding partnership of Doctors Worldwide Turkey. The project aims to increase the number of Muslim health workers, doctors and specialists in the region.

In the IUIU Habib Faculty of Medicine, supported by TIKA, Doctors WorldwideTurkey have provided voluntary (free) instructor support to manage the branch education programs and give department courses and have donated a large amount of books to the library of the Faculty of Medicine. Within the framework of the project, it has been planned to increase the number of instructors and to support the research laboratories.



IBNI SINA VOCATIONAL SCHOOL OF HEALTH SERVICES

One of the educational projects carried out to contribute to resolving Somalia's lack of health professionals has been to open Ibni Sina Vocational School of Health Services in Mogadishu, which has a population of about 2.5 million.

The Ibni Sina Vocational School of Health Services was opened with the support of Benadir University and TIKA. Educational activities were started with 77 students in 3 departments including Nursing, Midwifery and Laboratory in 2013-2014 academic year. With the addition of Public Health department, the number of students in the second academic year reached 143.

During their education, Ibni Sina students are provided internship programs in the leading hospitals of the region, such as the Doctors Worldwide Somalia Chifa Hospital, Figi Foundation Hospital, and Benadir University Hospital.



CONTINUING MEDICAL EDUCATION

In 2014, six people from Lebanon, Somalia, and Yemen were trained in relevant hospitals in Istanbul with the aim of creating opportunities to broaden the health professionals' expertise within the framework of Continuing Medical Education.



RADIOLOGY TRAINING IN AZERBAIJAN

Within the framework of educational and scientific projects, Doctors Worldwide Turkey provided theoretical and practical trainings on "Pediatric, Obstetric, Gynecology Imaging and Adult Abdominal Radiology" in Azerbaijan between April 1-19, 2014 with two volunteers from the University of Toronto.



DIABETES AND PHACO SURGERY TRAINING IN MORITANIA

Doctors Worldwide Turkey volunteer health care team provided diabetes training to the Mauritanian Ministry of Health employees between May 4-11, 2014 with the support of SESRIC, a subsidiary of the Organization for Islamic Cooperation (OIC). As part of this support, Mauritian eye specialists were trained on phaco surgery at the Nouakchott Cataract Center.

Doctors Worldwide Turkey Disaster Management Training

Doctors Worldwide Turkey have organized a training program to improve management capabilities of professionals working in disasters and emergencies.



The training covers subjects such as Disaster and Emergency Situations, Logistics Planning, Personnel Planning, Operations Planning and Management, Security, Incident Location Management, Leadership, Motivation and Team Management, Communication Techniques and Infrastructure Establishment, Map Using, Navigation and Location - Direction Finding Techniques, Survival under Difficult Conditions and Minimum Criteria for International Operations and had more than 80 participants consisting of NGO volunteers, health sector professionals and public sector members. Following the 2-day training organised with the contribution of Bezmialem University, the participants' disaster management competencies were tested through potential scenarios, and certificates were distributed to the participants.



February 5 A Heart Touching Film



While the war has been ongoing in Syria for years behind, public services such as health, education, and security are not distributed in the country to a large extent. Early intervention cannot be provided to those wounded during the ongoing conflicts in Syria as the health system collapsed. Doctors Worldwide Turkey, who accelerated their efforts to send 100,000 first-aid bags to the region within the scope of "I Need You" campaign, also produced a promotional film. Jordana Maurer delivered a striking film to the audience about Syria's situation and the scope of the campaign.





Light of Eve in Tanzania

Doctors Worldwide Turkey and the Voluntary Health Team of Azerbaijan Youth Support Fund were hosted by the Tanzanian REHEMA Foundation and supported by TIKA They examined and conducted the surgeries and postoperative surveys of the patients in Tanzania Mkuranga State Hospital. 54 surgeries and 593 eye examinations were carried out in the organization attended by doctors from Azerbaijan

and Turkey and the authorities of the cooperating institution. In addition, 163 glasses were distributed as donation from Turkey. Former Tanzanian President Ali Hasan Mwinyi, Turkish Ambassador to Darussalam Ali Davutoglu, Doctors Worldwide Turkey Vice President Dr. Havva Sula, Head of TIKA Central Asia and Caucasus Department Ali Özgün Öztürk and voluntary doctors attended the inaugural organization of the Azerbaijan-Turkey Cooperation Program in Tanzania on February 17-21, 2014, Former Tanzanian President Mwinyi, who wanted to have an eye examination after the opening of the program, was examined by Turkish and Tanzanian doctors. The 90-year-old former president Mwinyi thanked the voluntary doctors who prescribed him for the eye pain he had suffered.

March 14 The World Said "We are with you Syria!"

As we enter the third year in Syrian War, volunteers led by DWWT gathered in Sultanahmet Square, flew red balloons to symbolise their hope to end the bloodshed soon with the participation of several non-governmental organizations. In the speech which he made on behalf of the group, Dr. Kerem Kınık, the chairman of the board of DWW Turkey, said; "We gathered together to express that we are together with the Syrian people in the 3rd year of this grief.



Together with Doctors Worldwide Turkey and several other organisations, we will shout out to the world once again that this dirty war should stop. We will say 'We are on your side Syria!". Recalling that 160,000 people have lost their lives in Syria so far and 2.5 million Syrian are refugees. Kınık has also reported that two thirds of the hospitals in this country have been destroyed and providing medication and vaccination has become a problem. Kınık, stating that he calls out to the whole world, said; "Those who have authority and power, those who have responsibility! The sufferings of Syrian

people is enough! It has been 3 years and these people, away from their homes, are patiently expecting that this will come to an end". Kınık also said that people who have not lost their humanity and conscience say "We are with you Syria" in a great geography from America to the Pacific today, adding that they repeat this as a call of humanity no matter what their religion, language or color. Stating that they want the war and suffering come to an end, Kinik noted that the red balloons symbolise freedom and hope. Kınık also said, "We will fly these red balloons in our hands together hoping that the war and suffering ends, the conscience of mankind returns back to this direction and the responsible institutions step in." The group, including Syrian refugee children, then lit the lanterns and flew the balloons to the sky.

Therapeutic Aid to Sierra Leone

DWWT went to Sierra Leone in West Africa with the cooperation of the Free African Foundation and the support of TIKA. A surgical camp was organized in the region between 10-16 March with the purpose of treating patients who could not be operated due to lack of specialists. 49 serious Hernia operations were performed in the state hospital in Port Loko, Sierra Leone. A team of 5 doctors, including DWWT board member Prof. Orhan Alimoglu, performed critical surgeries during 5 days with busy schedule. Volunteer doctors, who pushed the limits in the hospital with no air conditioning or ventilation, treated 49 patients with severe hernia and analyzed their needs for the following visits.



Enthusiastic Meeting in Malatya

DWWT, with more than 3 volunteers from all around the world, met with faculty members and Young DWWT at the Inonu University Congress and Culture Center



on April 18. The volunteer health envoys met with the community in Malatya on April 19 at the Malatya Municipal Conference Hall. In the meeting, the DWWT administration made presentations to the participants. During the presentations, the activities of DWWT around the world and the problems that constitute the reason for these activities were shed light on, and the implemented solutions were explained. Dr. Kerem Kınık, Chairman of the Board of DWWT, mentioned that the movement of DWWT

emerged as the voice of the global conscience against the global injustice in the world. Dt. Hatice Öztürk Kınık told the young doctor candidates about the spirit of becoming a volunteer of Doctors Worldwide Turkey with her own experiences.



May 8 Albinism Conference in Tanzania

Doctors Worldwide Turkey went to Tanzania to give health care services to Albinism patients in Tanzania and to attend a conference on Albinism. Albinism is a genetic condition that arises when the melanin pigment that gives color to the skin, hair, and eves is partly or completely absent. One in every 17 thousand people in the world has Albinism. This situation, which may affect any human being and living creature from any race, means a life in more severe conditions for some people. At the request of the Embassy of Darussalam, DWWT participated in a project on diagnosis, treatment, and educational support for Albinos in Tanzania. Within the scope of the project, DWWT, participating in a conference on Albinism held in Darussalam conducted examinations on 244 Albinism patients and they distributed protective medication. A voluntary health team of 5 people consisting of 2 dermatologists, 1 ophthalmologist, 1 internal medicine specialist and the field coordinator also evaluated the medium and long term benefits that could be implemented in the country in terms of health.

Therapy Support for the Children of Miners

DWWT and Pedagogy Foundation applied Game Therapy to the children of the miners died in the mine disaster in Soma. The children were aged between 2-12. The project, which was implemented with the great contributions of the Soma Psychosocial Support Coordination Office established by the Ministry of Family and Social Policies, Manisa Provincial Directorate, was carried out at Soma Kurtulus Elementary School between June 18-26, 2014. Within the scope of the project, child-centered play therapy was applied to the children. This therapy created by Virginia Axline and developed to be more systematic by Garry Landreth. Puppet therapy and art therapy were applied to 2 children instead of child-centered play therapy, as they were older. Each child received a 40-minute treatment once a day. A total of 108 sessions of game therapy were applied to 18 children within 7 days. The therapies were made by a pedagogue, clinical psychologist, psychological counselor, play therapists. In the project, 18 children were taken on 6 sessions of therapy. Moreover, Therapeutic Toy Sets were given to 100 children with the contribution of Turkish Airlines employees.



Central African Mobilisation

The Doctors Worldwide Health Center, which was opened to serve 20,000 refugees who took shelter in the Central Mosque in Bangui, the capital of Central African Republic, became a hope for Muslims living in the Central African Republic. The building, formerly a municipal building in the center of the district, was transformed into a clinic where patients could be examined, inpatient treatment is provided, and laboratory tests can be made. The clinic also hosts a pharmacy. The DWWT clinic, where 1 doctor, 3 nurses, 2 midwives, 1 laborant, and 1 pharmacist serve, includes 1 laboratory, 1 pharmacy, and 6 beds. Up to now, more than 2,000 patients have been treated in our clinic where an average of 50 patients are treated daily.



'Travel Health Training'

DWWT, who traditionalised the Disaster Manager, First-aid, and Travel Health trainings organised a 'Travel Health and First-aid Training' which also includes the measures to be taken against epidemics such as Ebola. The program, which was attended by 50 people from different occupations and age groups, containes vital information for businessmen, journalists, and humanitarian volunteers who travel frequently. Recently, a curfew was announced in Sierra Leone due to the Ebole virus outbreak and the UN declared that a financial resource of more than 1 billion dollars is needed in the fight against the epidemic. These were the signs showing that Ebola would continue to occupy the world's agenda as a serious threat. The Ebola epidemic, which continues rapidly with an average of 70.8% fatality rate, killed 2,296 people in Africa, particularly in Guinea, Liberia, Sierra Leone, and Nigeria. Over the past few months, 144 health workers who have struggled with Ebola virus disease have lost their lives. Particularly in certain regions of the western African countries where the Ebola epidemic is actively undergoing and the sub-Saharan African countries, there is a high risk for the ones travelling to these countries. Whereas in areas where the Ebola virus is not present, other diseases such as malaria and yellow fever also pose a significant risk for the travellers.




INFORMATION TECHNOLOGIES

IT DEPARTMENT

Inline with the enlarging data structure of Doctors Worldwide Turkey, the IT department developed system and back up solutions and made improvements taking the increasing personnel number, number of donations, and amount of donations into consideration. These improvements mainly focused on the creation of a more powerful information system infrastructure, increasing the efficiency of the existing system, and technology and process renewal.

PHYSICAL SERVER

Physical Condition: The IT department has expanded the data and back up capacities, and in order to avoid losing the daily recorded data due to any disruption, they made daily and weekly backups and increased the sustainability and efficiency of the system. Our systems (Blade Servers) work with a Failover Cluster (the system continues to work through the running server in case one of the 2 servers fail) structure. In addition to this, this year we have also activated Disaster Recovery (the system continues to work, without any data loss, through the Backup HP server in case both of the Blade servers fail).



Crm (Customer Relationship Management)

The donator, stakeholder, supplier, volunteer, data, in order words the CRM data, which grows day by day, developed even more in 2013 and 2014.

Data singularisation (duplicate record clearing) was applied on the CRM data, two times in the last two years. Qurban Organization Management was taken over CRM, the deficiencies in 2013 were eliminated, and in 2014, the entire organization was carried out via CRM. As a result of the healthy results obtained through the Web Donation -CRM integration, and by integrating with 4 banks this year, the data was transferred to CRM properly.

Sharepoint

In 2014, the IT department has activated the Sharepoint application and has adapted - and still continues to adapt- it to our organisation to enable the follow-up of file sharing, content management, and business process management through a common portal.

Sites were created on the portal of each department. Department specific intelligent forms have been created and digital approval mechanisms have been established.



WEBSITE

The Quick Donation section of the Worldwide Doctors website has been renewed by a responsive design, which is compatible with mobile devices like Iphone, Ipad, and Android. In addition to our existing donation methods, Debit Card usage is also available as well as credit cards. The "3D Secure" system (payment security system) has also been added, which was frequently asked by the donators in 2013.

As in 2014, the IT Unit will continue focusing on strategic technology products, the efficiency of the institution, the continuity of donator and volunteer management, and the recording of follow-up processes in 2015.


