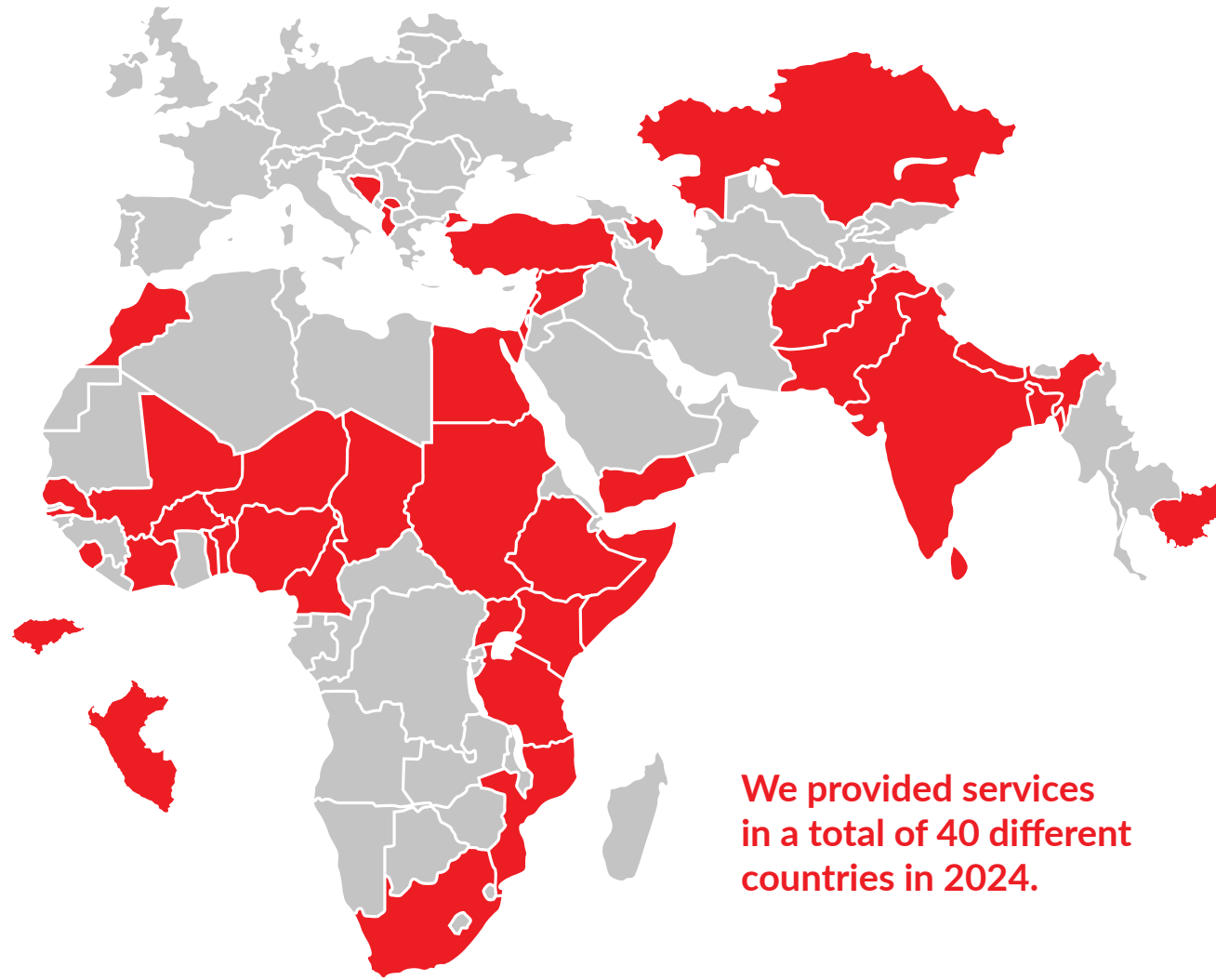

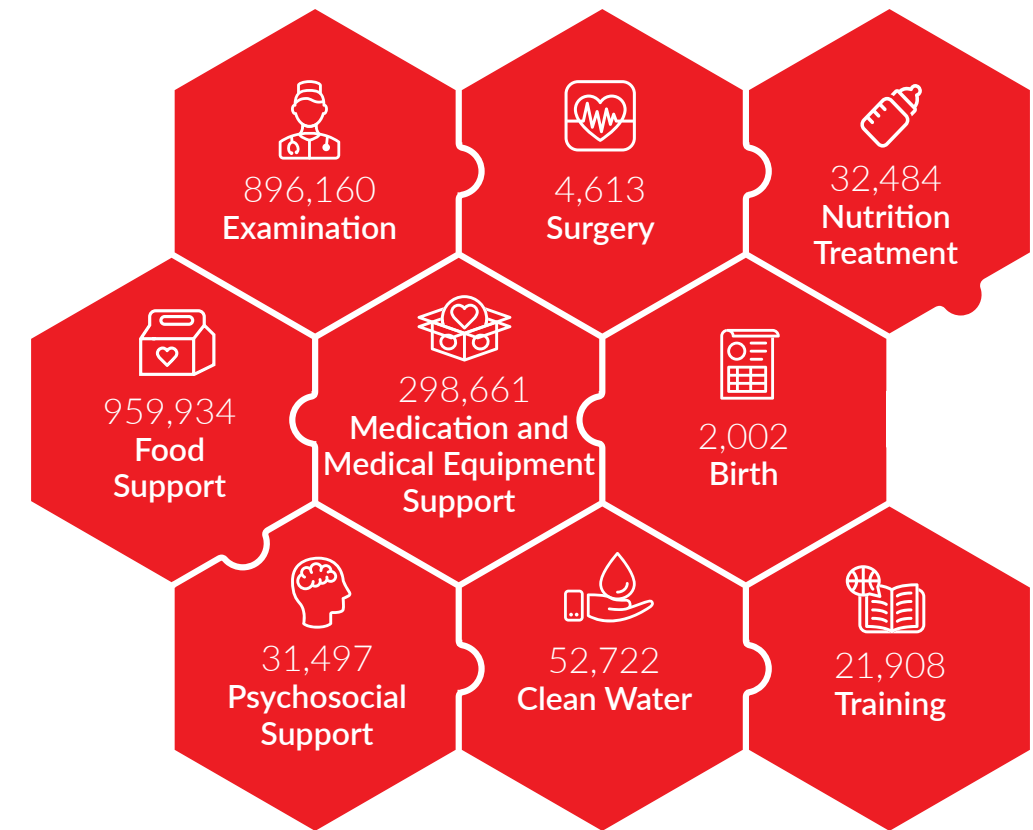

2.1. MISSION, VISION AND PRINCIPLES



2.1.1. Mission and Vision

Having started its activities as an international humanitarian aid organization focused on health, Yeryüzü Doktorları has carried out hundreds of projects so far in more than 65 countries with the support of more than 400 thousand donors and more than 45 thousand volunteers. Having set out initially by organizing short-term health care camps with volunteer medical teams, Yeryüzü Doktorları has started to accomplish longer-term projects in the course of time. As of 2024, it has volunteer medical team services, cataract camps, water well and food support activities, equipment - medication supports and medical training projects, as well as centers providing permanent services in 8 different countries including Afghanistan, Bangladesh, Chad, Palestine, Somalia, Syria, Yemen and Türkiye.

Mission:

To reach those in need who are unable to access health care services and to help them hold on to life.

Vision:

A leading and competent NGO in the field of medical aid.

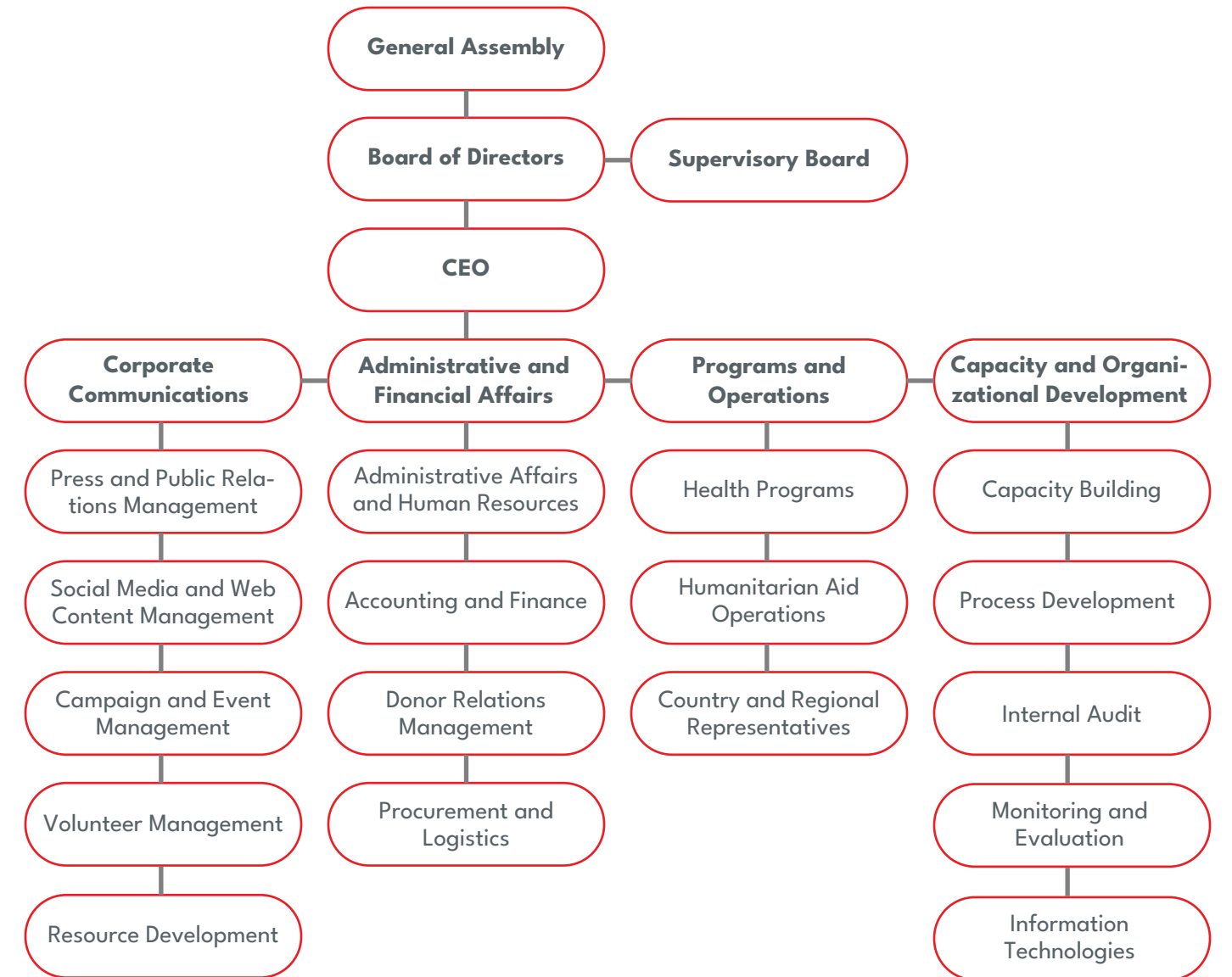

2.3. MAIN AREAS OF ACTIVITY

2.3.1. Emergency Projects

Yeryüzü Doktorları provides emergency treatment services by sending volunteer medical teams to the relevant region in the first place in the event of war and crisis situations as well as natural disasters such as earthquake, flood, fire, etc., and supplies medication and equipment. In line with the identified needs, it supports repair and operation of damaged hospitals or health centers, establishes field hospitals and health centers, and creates mobile health care teams. It develops and implements medium-long term projects so as to replenish the basic needs related to health care infrastructure affected by the crisis situation.



2.3.2. Maternal and Child Health Projects

Yeryüzü Doktorları opens maternal and child health centers and/or improves the existing centers in those regions where mother and child death are observed frequently. These centers provide health care services such as routine checks of pregnant and nursing mothers, performance of healthy deliveries, vaccination of babies, and performance of pediatric examinations. In addition, pregnant or nursing mothers or mothers who have recently given birth are provided with trainings on baby care and reproductive health.



2.3.3. Nutrition Health Projects

Within the scope of the nutrition health projects, Yeryüzü Doktorları establishes nutrition health centers and supports the existing ones in the regions with frequent hunger problems resulting from drought, poverty, internal disturbances and similar causes. The malnutrition developing especially in children younger than 5 years of age and in pregnant/nursing mothers due to poor nutrition is treated at these centers. In circumstances where medical nutrition treatment cannot be provided, nutritional support is provided through food packages, qurbani meat offered during Eid al-Adha, etc.



2.3.4. Eye Health Projects

Yeryüzü Doktorları treats eye diseases, in particular the cataract, and distributes eyeglasses as part of its eye health activities. It also aims to reinforce the local capacity by supporting the healthcare institutions in the regions where eye health projects are carried out, through activities such as establishment of eye surgery units and training of local healthcare personnel.



2.3.5. Volunteer Medical Team Projects

Yeryüzü Doktorları provides health care services in locations in need in the fields of both surgical and internal medicine. Accordingly, it organizes short-term camps in the cases where physical facilities are available but there is a lack of specialist physicians and costs of medications and consumables can generally not be covered. In these camps, people whose treatment needs advanced specialist knowledge are examined and operated on by the volunteer medical teams of Yeryüzü Doktorları. Trainings, on the other hand, that are aimed at exchange of information and experience with the local healthcare professionals during these practices constitute an indispensable part of this entire process.



2.3.6. Medical Training Projects

For the purpose of providing sustainable benefit, Yeryüzü Doktorları supports training, certification and specialization programs at associate, undergraduate and graduate levels, and contributes to scientific researches and events by organizing congresses so as to increase the capacity of healthcare professionals in the countries where the projects and programs are carried out.



2.3.7. Psychosocial Support Projects

Yeryüzü Doktorları carries out informative and supportive activities for the local community by conducting screening and examinations with the aim of psychosocial support for the people who have been affected by trauma, disaster and crisis situations. It determines the current status of the local mental health system and develops psychosocial support projects in line with the social needs. It also provides psychosocial assistance activities for the NGO staff and volunteer medical teams serving in the field.



2.3.8. WASH Projects

Yeryüzü Doktorları drills water wells and restores the infrastructures for clean water access in the regions where there is drought and the infrastructure is insufficient, so as to prevent the diseases resulting from use of dirty water. It also intervenes in the situations where urgent solutions are needed, by distributing water purification tablets.



2.4. NATIONAL AND INTERNATIONAL COLLABORATIONS

Yeryüzü Doktorları conducts its projects in coordination and collaboration with international organizations such as the World Health Organization (WHO), United Nations International Children's Emergency Fund (UNICEF), World Food Program (WFP), United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees (UNHCR), German Corporation for International Cooperation (GIZ) and International Organization for Migration (IOM), and national organizations such as Republic of Türkiye, Ministry of Health, Republic of Türkiye, Ministry of Interior, Republic of Türkiye, Ministry of Family, Labor and Social Services of the Republic of Türkiye, Turkish Cooperation and Coordination Agency (TIKA), Disaster and Emergency Management Presidency (AFAD) and Turkish Red Crescent. It also establishes partnerships with local health care authorities, national/international NGOs and universities on project basis in the countries where it carries out activities.

3.1. EMERGENCY PROJECTS

3.1.1. Afrin Jindires Refugee Health Center

Yeryüzü Doktorları established Jindires Refugee Health Center in October 2018 for the purpose of providing primary health care services to those refugees living in Muhammediye and Deyr Ballut camps located in Afrin/Jindires region of Syria. The center provides health care services in the branches of internal medicine, pediatrics, dental health and emergency observation. It also provides free medication support and carries out psychosocial support activities for children. As of December 2023, it started to provide mobile health services in Aleppo and its vicinity.

3.1.2. Suluk Health Center

Yeryüzü Doktorları has been providing primary health care services in the Tel Abyad/Suluk region of Syria since December 2020. The center provides services in the branches of internal medicine, pediatrics, gynecology, dental health, dermatology, emergency observation and ear, nose and throat. In addition to these services, patients are also provided with free medication support.

3.1.3. Palestine Program

Having carried out various activities in the field of health care since the 2000s in Gaza, where approximately 2 million Palestinians live, Yeryüzü Doktorları identified, as a result of the needs analyzes performed, that the biggest health problem in the region is the need for physical therapy and rehabilitation services, and focused its work in this field since 2014.

Within the scope of Gaza Physical Therapy and Rehabilitation Project, Yeryüzü Doktorları provided equipment and operation support in 2014 to two physical therapy and rehabilitation centers providing services with limited facilities in the Northern Gaza region and Gaza City, and established a new physical therapy and rehabilitation center in 2015 in the Khan Younis region to the south of Gaza.

In 2016, mobile health services were added to the project and home treatment, medical care and psychological support services started to be provided by 5 different teams consisting of 22 personnel. Teams operating in different cities in the Gaza Strip provided more than 65 thousand people with physical therapy and rehabilitation, medical wound care and psychosocial support services and medication and medical equipment support until 2023 through the Khan Younis Physical Therapy and Rehabilitation Center.

The 7th of October Crisis and Emergency Aid Activities

The humanitarian crisis which started in Palestine on October 7, 2023 caused one of the greatest destructions of recent years and is still ongoing. Yeryüzü Doktorları continued its services uninterruptedly during this difficult period, regardless of the circumstances. In the region where the intensity of attacks is increasing every passing day and access to basic needs is becoming increasingly difficult, various aids were provided to meet urgent needs.



In this context, 500 people were distributed flour sacks and 93 thousand 410 people were delivered hot meals in 2024. In addition, 2 thousand 542 food parcels were distributed and one thousand people were provided with infant formula support. In order to support the healthcare system, 82 thousand 444 people were provided with medication and medical and other equipment aid, and 725 people were provided with physical therapy and rehabilitation services.

Aid trucks prepared in Egypt and Jordan to be sent to our team in Gaza arrived the Rafah Border Gate and the Erez Border Gate, and 115 thousand 521 people were provided with aid. At the same time, aid supplies were delivered to the ship of goodness which was sent from Mersin to Gaza, and 5 thousand people were provided with support.

In order to ensure the continuity of health care services, healthcare professionals were provided with cash support and 386 people were provided with mobile medical team services. 365 thousand 91 people were examined throughout this process. In addition, one thousand 750 children benefited from various activities for psychosocial support of children.

Within the scope of the activities carried out, nearly 600 thousand people in need were delivered aid, and the region was provided with 2 ambulances to support the healthcare system of Gaza. Yeryüzü Doktorları continues its work with great self-devotion to meet the urgent needs of the people of Gaza and to support health care services.

3.1.4. Chad Sido Refugee Health Center

100 thousand refugees, who migrated to Chad due to the Central Africa crisis started in late 2013, have started to take shelter in the camps established in the southeast of the country. Having first supported a health care center in Bangui, the capital of Central African Republic, in the course of the crisis, Yeryüzü Doktorları started to provide health care services in Chad Doyaba Refugee Camp in July 2014.

In 2016, a new health care center was opened in Sido Refugee Camp located in Maro region of Chad, providing shelter for 50 thousand refugees. Within the center, which completed its eighth year at the end of 2024, services such as primary health care, medication support and basic laboratory tests are provided free of charge and on a regular basis. In addition, those in need who have difficulty in reaching the center are provided with health care services, through mobile teams.

3.1.5. Somalia Mogadishu Family Health Center

Mogadishu Family Health Center, located on the Afgoye road in Mogadishu, the capital of Somalia, where internally displaced people live, started to provide services in February 2019. Services such as primary health care, medication support and basic laboratory tests are provided within the center free of charge and on a regular basis.

3.1.6. Bangladesh Thaingkhali Refugee Health Center

Yeryüzü Doktorları has been operating uninterruptedly in Bangladesh since 2017, and provides services in the region such as primary health care service, hygiene kit distribution, qurbani operations, food parcel distribution, iftar organizations and cataract camps .

Thaingkhali Refugee Health Center carries out its operations in the refugee camp no. 19 in Cox's Bazaar region of Bangladesh since June 2020. Within the center, primary health care services and free medication support are provided for refugees.

3.1.7. Türkiye-Syria Earthquake (6th of February Kahramanmaraş Earthquake)

During the earthquakes that occurred on February 6, 2023, centered in Kahramanmaraş and caused great destruction in Syria as well, 50 thousand 783 people in Türkiye and minimum 8 thousand 476 people in Syria lost their lives, and more than 122 thousand people were injured, according to official figures.

11 provinces of us, including Kahramanmaraş, Hatay, Adıyaman and Malatya, were affected by this earthquake, which was described as the "Disaster of the Century".

Having arrived in the region within the first 24 hours of the earthquake with volunteer medical teams from all over Türkiye, Yeryüzü Doktorları delivered humanitarian aid supplies to those in need and started the first interventions. During this period, surgeries were performed for earthquake victims in the fields of orthopedics and gynecology, and earthquake victims who gave birth suddenly or were about to lose their limbs held on to life by means of these interventions. Earthquake victims were provided with examination, treatment and medication support services within the scope of primary health care service provided in tent hospitals erected in the earthquake region. At the same time, in order to reduce the psychological effects of the earthquake on disaster victims, psychosocial support tents were erected and both group and individual interview sessions



were held along with activities for children and adults, accompanied by expert psychologists.

In addition to the health care services provided in the earthquake region during Ramadan, food parcels were distributed in tents and container cities in order to meet the food needs in the region and to support nutrition health. Again, within the scope of qurbani operations carried out in the earthquake region during Eid al-Adha, 229 animals were sacrificed on share basis and their meats were distributed to 13 thousand 466 beneficiaries.

Having continued its services since the first day of the earthquake, Yeryüzü Doktorları provided primary health care support and psychosocial support services and distributed hygiene kits and food parcels, domestically in Kahramanmaraş, Adıyaman, Hatay and Malatya. It also played an active role in the Jindires region of Syria, where the effects of the earthquake were felt, and supported the earthquake victims with its health care services. The work, which continued in 2024 as well in 4 provinces, was completed on July 31, 2024.

Kahramanmaraş

Having arrived in the region on the first day of the earthquake, Yeryüzü Doktorları erected a tent hospital in Oniki Şubat Stadium during the acute period, and provided the earthquake victims with examination, treatment and medication support services, with volunteer medical teams.

Having continued its activities in Sakarya Container City following start of construction of container cities, Yeryüzü Doktorları provided earthquake victims with health care support through primary health care services. In addition, it aimed to reduce the psychological effects of the earthquake on disaster victims by conducting individual and group interviews within the scope of the psychosocial support activities it provided. It carried out instructive and developing activities by carrying out child-friendly area activities for children. In addition, it formed mobile medical teams for those in need in the earthquake region, who did not have access to a health support station, and provided earthquake victims in rural areas with services, through these mobile teams. Food parcels and hygiene kits were distributed to those in need at certain periods.

The work carried out in the Kahramanmaraş region was completed on March 31, 2024.

Hatay

In Hatay, which suffered serious destruction during the earthquake, a tent hospital was first erected during the acute period, and mobile medical teams were sent to rural areas where health care service was needed. At the same time, emergency surgeries were performed in the first weeks by volunteer physicians in hospitals that remained intact.

Having continued their activities in Qatar Container City following the establishment of container cities, Yeryüzü Doktorları teams continued their activities by establishing health support stations and psychosocial support centers, and distributed food parcels and hygiene kits to those in need at regular intervals.

The work carried out in the Hatay region was completed on July 31, 2024.

Adıyaman

At the health station, which was established in Adıyaman at the first stage with 2 containers, earthquake victims were provided with primary health care service and medication support. In addition to health care services, emergency aid packages were delivered to earthquake victims.

In Vartana Temporary Prefabricated Container City, psychosocial support activities and individual and group interviews were carried out, child-friendly area activities were organized, and activities were continued to reduce the effects of the earthquake on children. In this context, movie screening and playing activities were organized to reach children affected by earthquake, and primary health care services were continued at the health support station which was established.

The work in Adıyaman was completed on March 31, 2024 in line with the planned targets.

Malatya

Having carried out its activities in Malatya Sugar Factory during the acute period, Yeryüzü Doktorları provided psychosocial support services for children from the very first moment, and held individual and group interviews for earthquake victims suffering from post-traumatic stress disorder.

Later, the psychosocial support station was moved to the Central Malet Container City and served earthquake victims with group interviews, individual interviews, psychoeducation and child-friendly area activities. With the service they named “Health Street”, Volunteer medical students reached 120 earthquake victims in the field of health care.

The psychosocial support area in Malatya was named after Elif Şeyma Dalhançer, a Young Doctors Worldwide volunteer who died in the earthquake, and healing of the wounds of earthquake victims in the region continued, by honoring her memory. In addition, it formed mobile medical teams for those in need in the earthquake region, and provided earthquake victims in rural areas with health care services, through these mobile teams.

The work carried out in the Malatya region was completed on March 31, 2024.

Yeryüzü Doktorları provides emergency treatment services and medication and equipment support, primarily by sending voluntary medical teams in case of war and crisis situations as well as natural disasters such as earthquake, flood, fire, etc., occurred in different geographies in the world. In line with the identified needs, it supports repair and operation of damaged hospitals or health centers, establishes field hospitals and clinics, and forms mobile medical teams. It develops and implements medium-long term projects so as to replenish the basic needs related to health care infrastructure affected by the crisis situation. In addition, it works to heal the wounds with services related to meeting the basic needs such as food support, hygiene kits and access to clean water.

3.3.5. Food Aids

During the Ramadan period in 2024, 7 thousand 625 food parcels were distributed in 28 countries, including Afghanistan, Bangladesh, Benin, Chad, India, Kazakhstan, Azerbaijan, Mali, Niger, Pakistan, Somalia, Syria, Yemen, Sri Lanka, Uganda, Peru, Cameroon, Honduras, Kosovo, Tanzania, Lebanon, Sudan, Palestine, Egypt, Albania, Ivory Coast, Cambodia and Türkiye, and 13 thousand people were offered iftar meals in Ethiopia, Togo and Syria. In addition, 670 food parcels were distributed for urgent needs in addition to the Ramadan period.

A total of 189 thousand 677 people were reached within the scope of the food aids.



3.3.6. Qurbani Activities

Within the scope of 2024 qurbani activities, 37 thousand 235 animals were sacrificed on share basis and their meats were distributed to 770 thousand 257 people, in 24 different countries.

3.4. EYE HEALTH PROJECTS

Yeryüzü Doktorları has carried out eye health projects since 2006 in 21 different countries in total, including Afghanistan, Bangladesh, Chechnya (RF), Ethiopia, Gambia, Cameroon, Kenya, Democratic Republic of Congo, Lebanon, Mali, Mauritania, Niger, Nigeria, Pakistan, Sierra Leone, Somalia, Sri Lanka, Sudan, Tanzania, Uganda and Yemen. In addition to the treatment services provided within the scope of the projects, efforts were also made to enhance the local health care services capacity with the activities such as establishment of surgical eye units and training of local healthcare personnel.

In 2024, 23 thousand 846 eye examinations were performed, 3 thousand 640 eye surgeries were performed and a total of 5 thousand 705 eyeglasses were distributed during the activities carried out in 18 different countries, including Afghanistan, Bangladesh, Nigeria, Cameroon, Somalia, Ethiopia, Yemen, Niger, Nepal, Tanzania, Cambodia, Uganda, Sri Lanka, Burkina Faso, Senegal, Pakistan, Sierra Leone and Syria.

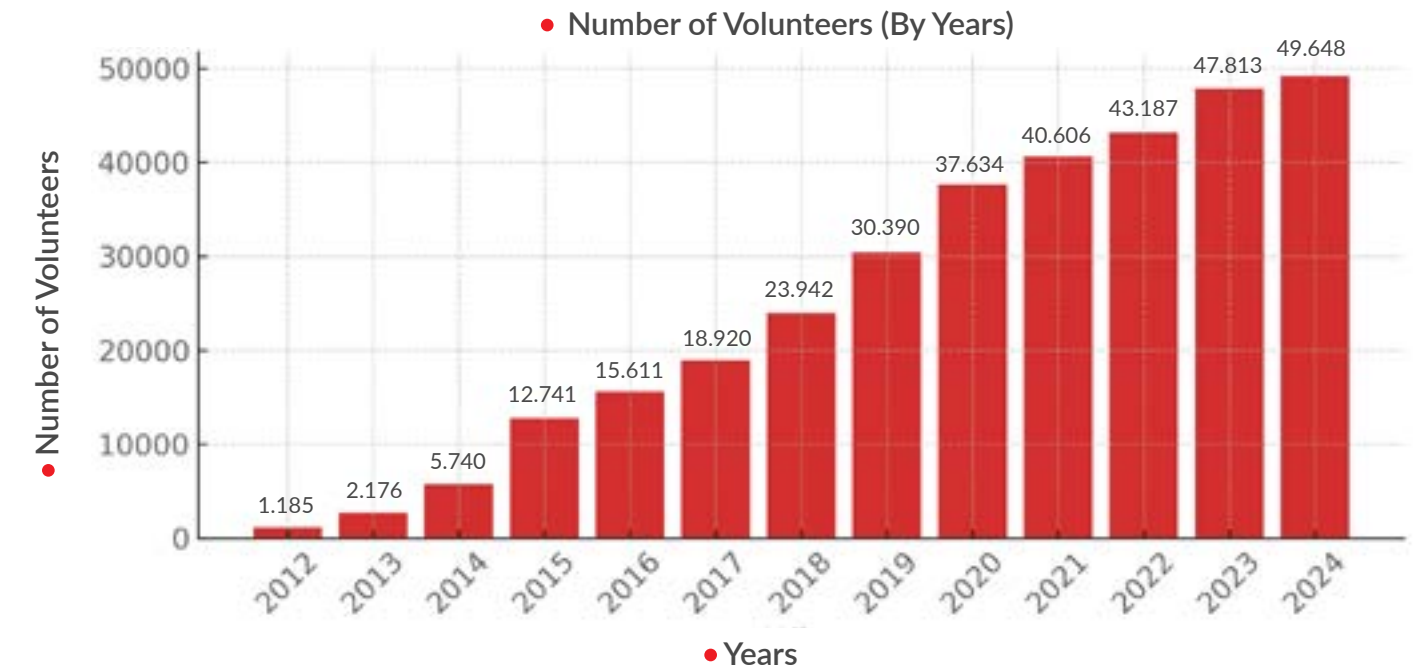

Yeryüzü Doktorları has already reached out to hundreds of thousands of people with the support of those who set their heart on goodness, and managed to make the world a better place thanks to these kind hearts. Young Doctors Worldwide (Young DWW) are the volunteers of Yeryüzü Doktorları who receive education in various departments of universities, including in particular the medical specialization areas. Young DWW organize trainings, seminars and conferences and conduct projects on volunteering basis for the purpose of spreading humanitarian aid and social responsibility awareness in university communities.

Young Doctors Worldwide carried out 352 activities in 55 universities throughout 2024.
